What is the Iowa County Community Foundation

The Iowa County Community Foundation, an affiliate of the Community Foundation of Northeast Iowa, is created by and for the people of Iowa County. The Community Foundation's main goals are to support Iowa County and to attract additional funds to assist donors in creating lasting legacies through a variety of giving options.

What We Support

Eligibility to Apply for Funding

- Applying organizations must be tax-exempt, non-profit entities classified by the IRS as 501(c) (3) organizations or government entities. If you have questions about eligibility or this classification, please contact our administrative office at 319-243-1358. If an organization is NOT classified by the IRS as a 501(c)(3) charitable organization, or equivalent, they must partner with an eligible Legal Applicant/Fiscal Sponsor, who must submit the application. **Note: Fiscal Sponsors are legally and financially responsible for funds that are approved and granted from ICCF.**
- One application per organization (exceptions may be made for government entities or Fiscal Sponsor organizations).
- There are no set of criteria that, if met, will guarantee funding.
- If the organization has received past funding from the Iowa County Community Foundation, all grant reporting must be up to date and in good standing, or they will be considered ineligible to apply.

CONSIDER APPLYING! We look for new ways to have a positive impact on Iowa County through innovative and high-impact grants.

Applications must be submitted by 11:59 pm (CST) on April 1, 2017

Review Criteria

- The relevance of the proposed project to ICCF's mission areas of focus (the extent to which the proposal addresses a community need, demonstrates broad-based community support, and provides benefits to the community-at-large)
- Ability of the proposed project to leverage funding and support from other sources
- Extent to which the proposal maximizes community resources through cooperation and collaboration with other organizations in the community and the elimination of redundant services, programs, or projects
- The capacity of the applicant's organization and staff to achieve the desired result
- The sustainability of the proposed project without additional long-term financial commitments from ICCF

Applying for a Grant

Applicants interested in seeking grants from the Iowa County Community Foundation are required to submit a completed grant application via the Foundation's online grant application system available on the Community Foundation's website: www.iowaccf.org.

Awarded applicants are required to:

1. Sign a Terms of Grant Agreement clarifying legal parameters for use of the grant.
2. Submit a short online report by **December 31, 2017** on the outcome of the funded project.

A step-by-step guide and a video tutorial are available on the website to help applicants in the process.

Incomplete or hard copy applications will not be considered.

Applications must be submitted by 11:59 pm (CST) on April 1, 2017

When are grants awarded?

Charitable grants from the Iowa Community Foundation will be approved in June 2017. All applicants will be notified of the results of the grant process by June 30, 2017.
